

Tips to follow before COVID vaccination

Do	Don't
drink plenty of water and stay hydrated	smoke or consume alcohol as it may dehydrate you at least 2 days' prior.
get good, peaceful sleep at night.	take any blood thinners you may be taking for any reason at least 2 days' prior
eat well as you go for your vaccine dose. Include leafy vegetables, food rich in antioxidants that help boost immunity.	take vaccine on an empty stomach.
wear a sleeveless or short-sleeved shirt or dress to facilitate getting the injection on your arm.	take over-the-counter pain killers, if you want to avoid side effects from the vaccine at least 1 day.
wear double mask & Maintain social distancing at the Vaccination centre (in our office premises)	-
cancel your Vaccination if you notice any Covid- like symptoms.	-

be prepared for some side effects as your body	-
builds immune protection. These may go away in	
1-2 days.	
The side effects can be:	
1. Pain and redness at the site of	
injection	
2. Chills and mild fever	
3. Headache	
4. Fatigue and body ache	
5. Joint and muscle pain	
take Dolo 650/Crocin/paracetamol if you have	-
any of the above symptoms. If they last for more	
than a week, contact our BPHRs immediately.	
wear light clothes.	-

Few other points to remember:

- After the second dose of the vaccine, you may experience similar symptoms seen after the first dose. If the side effects persist for more than 1-2 days, contact our BPHRs immediately.
- Remember that the antibodies that develop after the second dose of the vaccine reach a protective level after a minimum 15 days. Hence, be careful; do not relax the preventive measures.
- It is also important to discuss with your doctor if you have been on immunosuppressants, such as methotrexate. Your doctor might put the medication on hold for two weeks after the Covid-19 vaccine.

Note: If you're having any severe allergies or ailments, kindly confirm with your treating physician before vaccination
